What we teach:

- * The principles of jumping, progressing from basic position over a single jump to mastering the art of riding a course.
- * The skills needed to prepare and succeed at showing.

Summer Day Camps for Horse Crazy Kids!

We offer three Theme Camps during the following weeks:

- Session One: August 9-13th — "Aboriginal" Week
 - Session Two: August 16-20th — "Scrapbook" Week
 - Session Three: August 23-27th — "Full Immersion Boot Camp"
- Our camps are 5-day camps with one night sleepover for horse crazy kids aged 7 to 14 years.

Summer horse camps run Monday to Friday from 9am to 4pm (early drop off and late pick-ups are available). All our campers will spend 80% of their time hands on with the horses, both in the stables and the riding ring. They will also receive theory lessons from our qualified staff all in an effort to learn to become an equestrian rider. Each day all the campers will have a minimum two hours a day riding. This instructional period (not just a trail ride) is when we teach the new equestrian proper control of their horse, safety around horses and how to handle their mounts in a group riding lesson.

As the week progresses, the camper learns more about being a good rider and readying themselves for our "mock horse show" and riding demonstration that will take place on Friday. Our horse show is a fun event to "show off" to loved ones and visitors what each camper learned during the week. Competing against each other, all are awarded in each class - everyone goes home with a ribbon!

The shows take place at 2pm on the Friday of the camp that the student participates in and all family members are welcome to come watch, cheer on your rider and have fun. A short graduation ceremony follows the show.

Every Thursday night, all campers can sleep over in tents or our bunk house. The fun includes a BBQ dinner, bonfire, and camp sing songs. Friday morning we rise to breakfast hosted by the camp and then all riders are off to the stables to ready their mounts for the show. Lunch will be supplied by the camp.

Checklist for "What to Bring & Wear" to Day Camps:

- nutritious snack, lunch and drinks, water bottles for refilling
- riding boots with a heel (no running shoes, please!)
- clothing suitable for riding (tights, jogging pants or breeches) please no jeans
- change of clothing for hot days, (shorts or bathing suit and a towel for water sports)
- Sun protection lotion
- We supply riding helmets for each camper (bring your own if you have one)
